

## HEALTHRIGHT 360 VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY



**Volunteer Position:** Photography Group Volunteer

**Program:** Tenderloin Health Services

**Commitment:** Every other Wednesday 4-6pm, plus 5-10 additional hours/week for 3 months

**Who We Are:** Health**RIGHT** gives hope, builds health, and changes lives for people in need. We do this by providing compassionate, integrated care that includes primary medical, mental health, substance use disorder treatment and re-entry services. The 2011 merger of two historic organizations, Haight Ashbury Free Clinics and Walden House, both founded in the 1960's, created Health**RIGHT**. Asian American Recovery Services (AARS) joined the family of Health**RIGHT** 360 programs in 2013. Founded in 1985, AARS had grown to serve thousands of people throughout San Francisco, San Mateo, and Santa Clara counties. In 2014, North County Serenity House of San Diego County and Women's Recovery Association (WRA) of San Mateo joined Health**RIGHT** 360, continuing its leadership as a provider of gender responsive services for women and women with children. In 2015, Lyon-Martin Health Services became the third primary care clinic operated by Health**RIGHT** 360, continuing its specialized care for women and transgender individuals. Tenderloin Health Services (formerly Glide Health Services clinic) became the fourth primary care clinic in 2015, providing care in San Francisco's Tenderloin neighborhood.

### **Position Description:**

Tenderloin Health Services is looking for a volunteer for our Snapping Back photography group. We work with patient artist to explore a variety of topics through photography. The group meets every other Wednesday from 4pm to 6pm. We are looking for a volunteer available during our Wednesday meetings as well as 5-10 additional hours per week. Volunteer time is flexible but must take place between 8:30 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday. Photography experience is preferred but not necessary. A three month commitment is required. Task will include scanning film, printing, setting up for our Wednesday meetings and helping organize our gallery opening at the end of December.

Our past cohort focused on Substance abuse and recovery. Their work is currently on display at the Tenderloin Museum through the month of October. Our new Cohort will focus on living in SROs and will begin on September 21<sup>st</sup>.

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
