MPACT REPORT 2022 - 2023 HealthRIGHT 360 gives hope, builds health, and changes lives for people in need. We do this by providing compassionate, integrated care that includes primary medical, dental, mental health, substance use disorder treatment and re-entry services.



#### REFLECTIONS FROM OUR CEO

Dear Friends,

HealthRIGHT 360 is the largest provider of comprehensive substance use and mental health disorder treatment for California's most vulnerable communities. The vast majority of those we serve are experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity and almost two-thirds are people of color. Most struggle with dual diagnosis of substance use and mental health disorders, with years of untreated, chronic medical conditions, including diabetes, HIV/AIDS, and heart disease. Helping high-risk, vulnerable populations transition from addiction and homelessness to recovery, housing, and economic security is a major focus of HealthRIGHT 360.

With over 55 years of experience serving people struggling with addiction, we are committed to doing whatever is necessary to improve the health and quality of life for people who use drugs. The United States is in the middle of an unprecedented overdose crisis that is seeing close to 300 people nationwide die each day.

However, there are innovative emergency solutions. This past year, to help address this crisis, HealthRIGHT 360 operated the Tenderloin Center in San Francisco. It was a novel, pilot project designed to be temporary, and in response to the crisis unfolding in the center of San Francisco. In the 11 months during which the program operated, our team saved 333 lives. We had countless meaningful engagements with people who, sadly, too many in our community view as less than human. We brought in people who were using illicit substances out on the streets and provided a safe, private space away from the public. Open 12 hours every day, we served over 350 people daily.

We provided moments of normalcy and safety for people who are experiencing homelessness, using drugs, sleeping outside with one eye open, getting chased away by police, not having any money or warm clothes or even a tent, or any sense of security. We know that shame and misery keep people ashamed and miserable, but that compassion, empathy, and genuine connection helps to open a world of possibilities

The work that was done by our Tenderloin Center team was remarkable, just as is the work all our staff do on a daily basis. There is this growing sense of doom across the country. We counter that narrative every day as we welcome people into our care, and as we help people along their own path towards health.

Taking stock of all the good that we do, little moments and little miracles, I collect stories from staff. You have no idea how restorative this is. Please read the stories in this report and be inspired. I am grateful that your eyes and heart are open to the work that we do and the impact we have.

I want to leave you with a quote from Eeyore, "It never hurts to look for a little sunshine".

#### NEW PROGRAMS AND SERVICES 2022 - 2023

How HealthRIGHT 360 is furthering our mission to provide non-judgmental healthcare to people and communities in need.

#### **Northern California**

#### Joe Healy Detox & Acceptance Place Gay Men's Residential, San Francisco

HealthRIGHT 360 incorporated the Joe Healy Detox and Acceptance Place programs into our San Francisco residential facilities. Acceptance Place specializes in residential substance use disorder treatment services for males who identify as gay, bisexual, or transgender.

#### SoMa RISE Center, San Francisco

SoMa RISE is a drug crisis response center in the South of Market (SoMa) neighborhood of San Francisco that provides a welcoming and safe alternative off the streets for intoxicated people who are struggling with substance use.

#### Southern California

#### Mind OC, Orange County

HealthRIGHT 360 provides residential substance use disorder treatment services as part of the new Be Well OC Campus in Orange County. In addition, we provide incidental medical services and Medication-Assisted Treatment services for opioid withdrawal. Participants can be linked to on-site mental health services.

#### Martin Luther King Jr. Behavioral Health Center, Los Angeles

At the new comprehensive MLK Behavioral Health Center, Prototypes provides residential substance use disorder treatment, case management services including linkages, referrals, and community reintegration, and recovery support services to adults healing from addiction and people who are referred to treatment as part of criminal justice deferment.

#### **Mentored Internship Program**

Our Mentored Internship Program provides paid internships for mental health and substance use disorder counselors in our San Francisco Integrated Care Center, Prototypes Pomona Family Campus, and Prototypes Pasadena. Interns receive on-the-job training and experience, mentorship from experienced HealthRIGHT 360 staff, and provide services to HealthRIGHT 360 clients appropriate for the type and level of internship.





#### **HEALTHRIGHT 360 FAMILY OF PROGRAMS**

Asian American Recovery Services provides an array of culturally competent behavioral health services to the Asian, Pacific Islander, and other ethnically diverse communities of the San Francisco Bay Area. Our programs serve youth, adults, and families, and are located in San Francisco, Santa Clara, and San Mateo and Alameda Counties.

Haight Ashbury Medical Clinics offers primary medical, dental, substance use disorder treatment, and mental health services guided by its historic principle that "Healthcare is a Right, Not a Privilege." Our supportive staff is experienced addressing the complex healthcare needs that result from homelessness, poverty, and addiction. Clinic providers have specialized expertise in preventative health, chronic conditions, infectious disease, and addiction.

**North County Serenity House** provides a gender-responsive and trauma-informed environment, using evidence-based and best practices that recognize and account for the role that trauma frequently plays in the lives of the women and mothers. NCSH operates residential and outpatient programs throughout San Diego County.

**Prototypes** is a lifeline to women who are struggling with addiction and other serious issues such as domestic violence and mental illness. Mothers with small children may enter residential treatment as a family. Prototypes operates several sites throughout Southern California, serving thousands of women, men, and children each year.

**Rock Medicine** provides mobile medical triage and coverage for concerts, music festivals, sporting events, parades, and other large events throughout California. Now celebrating its 50th anniversary, Rock Med volunteers still provide free, non-judgmental care and set the standard in event medicine.

Walden House has been providing behavioral health services since 1969, serving people with mental health and substance use disorder issues at various residential and outpatient facilities throughout California, including incustody treatment programs and services for people transitioning back into their communities.

**Women's Recovery Association** in San Mateo provides a comprehensive continuum of care including residential treatment programs, professional clinical services, and community peer support. The comprehensive programming includes individual and family counseling, group therapy, and educational groups that focus on women's recovery from substance use disorder and related addictive behaviors.


